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# PROVIDER NOTICE

## CONTRA COSTA COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH STD CONTROL PROGRAM

Per a recent change to Title 17 Section 2500 (Provider Reporting), chlamydia is no longer provider reportable effective October 1, 2019. Chlamydia remains lab reportable, but clinicians are no longer mandated to submit a Confidential Morbidity Report (CMR) for chlamydia.

Given the alarming increases in sexually transmitted infections in Contra Costa County and the potentially serious effects of untreated chlamydia on newborns, **we are requesting that providers continue to report chlamydia infections in pregnant women to the STD Control Department.**

All gonorrhea and syphilis infections remain provider reportable to the Public Health Department. To report an infection, please fax a completed CMR to 925-313-6758. For STD reporting questions, please call 925-313-6750.
